Article 13 Every child must be free to express their thoughts and opinions and to access all kinds of information, as long as it is within the law.

Article 14 Every child has the right to think and believe what they choose and also to practise their religion, as long as they are not stopping other people from enjoying their rights. Governments must respect the rights and responsibilities of parents to guide their child as they grow up.

Article 15 Every child has the right to meet with other children and to join groups and organisations, as long as this does not stop other people from enjoying their rights.

- ✓ Having a School Council
- ✓ Incorporating debating as part of our curriculum
- ✓ Allowing pupils to vote for House Captains
- ✓ Ensuring all pupils are listened to by adults
- ✓ Recognising Parliament Week and welcoming local MPs into school

The Rule of Law

- ✓ Classes creating Class Rules
- \checkmark Having a clear Positive Behaviour Policy that is explained to all
- ✓ Organising visits from the Police service to reinforce the message of right and wrong
- ✓ Highlighting the Ten Commandments and the teaching of the Church.

Individual Liberty

- ✓ Encouraging pupils to be independent in their learning.
- ✓ Providing pupils with opportunities for reflection on responsibilities

Mutual Respect

- ✓ Having a Mission Statement which is inclusive.
- ✓ Constantly promoting respect for one another as good manners
- ✓ Reinforcing the value of everyone's opinions in class
- ✓ Having an effective Anti-Bullying Policy
- ✓ Emphasising in RE and PSHE lessons that every person is unique and 'created in the image of God'
- ✓ Supporting charitable works
- ✓ Placing emphasis on understanding and upholding the United Nations Convention for the Rights of the Child
